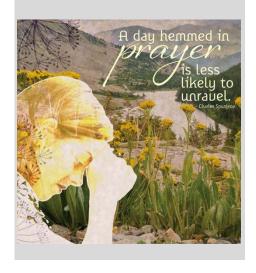

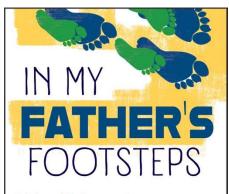

- Pencil
- Black permanent marker



What you do:

- 1. In the center of the paper, trace your foot in pencil. Darken the outline with marker.
- 2. Color or paint the footprint. Let it dry.
- 3. Trace your father's foot (same side) on top of your footprint (with yours in the middle of his).
- 4. Color or paint his footprint. Let it dry.
- 5. Sign your names and the date at the bottom.
