I read this week a reply by the Billy Graham.org website answering a question from someone from another country about the meaning of July 4th? Would you be able to tell someone from another country why July 4th is significant to Americans? Here is Billy Graham's excellent reply:

"July 4th commemorates the day in 1776 that our nation declared itself to be an independent nation, and no longer a colony of England. On that date, a number of our leading citizens signed what is known as the Declaration of Independence, stating our determination to become a free country.

Our independence did not come easily; only after several difficult years of war would it finally be won. Nor were our first years as a nation free from problems and controversies (as is still true). But our forefathers were determined to establish a free and democratic system of government, and the Declaration of Independence (together with our Constitution and the Bill of Rights) became the foundation for this. They have stood the test of time, and on July 4th we give thanks for the wisdom and faith and courage of those leaders.

Although it is not a religious holiday like Christmas or Easter, for many Americans July 4th is a time to reflect on God's goodness to us as a nation. Molded into the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia (which proclaimed our independence) are these words from the Bible:

"Proclaim liberty throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof" (Leviticus 25:10, KJV).

While we look with gratitude to the past on this July 4th, may we also look in faith to the future, and commit it and our lives to God and His will. The ancient words of the Psalmist are still true: "Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord" (Psalm 33:12)."

There are many examples of the influence belief in God and the Holy Scripture had on the founding of our nation. Here are just a few of them: There is a Bible in the cornerstone of the Washington Monument and the aluminum cap bears the inscription, Laus Deo, "Praise God." Molded into the East Facade of the Supreme Court Building is Moses with the tablets of the 10 Commandments; Library of Congress -"Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself." (Leviticus 19:18); US Capital -"Preserve me, O God, for in thee do I put my trust." (Psalm 16:1); Jefferson Memorial -"Indeed I tremble for my country when I reflect that God is just, that His justice cannot sleep forever." (Psalm 145:17-19); Lincoln Memorial -"That this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom — and that government of the people, by the people, and for the people, shall not perish from the earth." (John 3); Union Station -"The truth shall make you free." (John 8:32); Holocaust Memorial Museum -"You are my witness." (Isaiah 43:10); Confederate Monument -"And they shall beat their swords into ploughshares and their spears into pruning hooks." (Isaiah 2:4)
