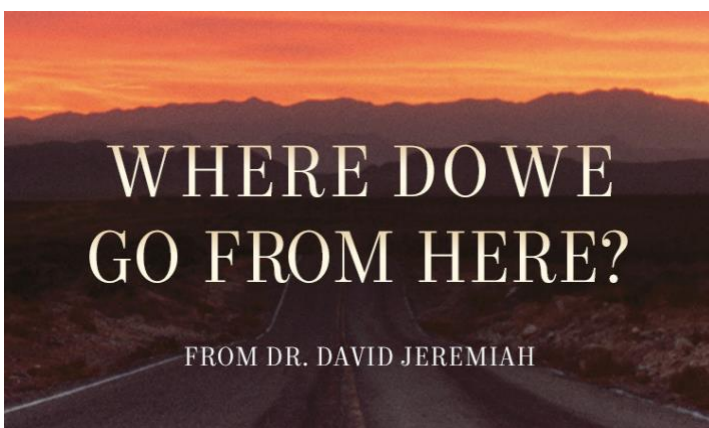

The Woman Behind the Name Lottie Moon

Lottie Moon, how much do you know about her? We know we take up the Lottie Moon Offering for International Missions, but have you ever considered what she was like, her dreams, her goals, and her desires? Although we think of her as larger than life, she was a real person with the same dreams and ambitions as other women throughout history.

Lottie Moon sailed for China in 1873. Do you think she left a special someone behind because he did not share her call to missions? Did she grow lonely for companionship, someone to grow old with? There was no eHarmony.com in China in 1873. Intermarriage across cultures was not accepted. There were millions of men in China, but none for her. Did Lottie look longingly at newborn babies and know that motherhood would never be in her future?

Did she find the customs, smells, and food of her new land foreign to her senses? Did the strange food make her stomach queasy? When I was a teenager, I attended an International Youth Conference in Switzerland. One night for supper, the main dish was goat tongue. I lived on chocolate bars (fortunately, the Swiss are famous for their

chocolate). After just one week, I was starving for some good old mom's cooking. Lottie served in China for 39 years. Do you think she yearned for some familiar foods of her youth?

Did Lotte grow homesick as the years passed? During the 39 years she served in China, she returned to America only three times! She missed many family milestones – weddings, birthdays, and funerals. She could not hear her family's voices – there were no cell phones. Communication was slow because letters were sent by ship across the many miles of ocean, taking months to reach their destination.

Lottie grew up in a privileged home. She was well educated, earning a Master of Arts degree. Besides English, she was fluent in four languages – French, Latin, Greek, and Hebrew. She could have had anything she wanted, but she left it all to travel around the world to tell the people of China the good news!

Lottie Moon gladly adopted her new homeland's customs, food, and dress. She lived as any native Chinese person lived.

Lottie suggested that an offering be taken at Christmas time, "when hearts are tender," for foreign missions. Therefore, it was fitting that years later the offering would be named for her to honor her sacrifice.

Ironically, Lottie Moon arrived at her mission field on Christmas Eve and died on Christmas Eve, 1912, on a ship bound for America. She weighed only 50 pounds at the time of her death. China was experiencing war and famine during those years. It is said that she gave her

own food to the starving Chinese people; she loved them more than she loved herself.

As the time for the Lottie Moon Offering for International Missions approaches, remember the person behind the name, Lottie Moon.

Lottie Moon's Plain Tea Cake

Adapted recipe for today's cooks:

2 cups of flour
1/2 cup butter
1 heaping cup of sugar
1 well-beaten egg
1 tablespoon cream

Cream the butter and sugar. Add the egg and mix well. Add the flour and cream. Dust a board with flour. Roll the dough very thin. Cut cookies with a round cookie cutter. Place on a buttered or nonstick cookie sheet. Bake at 475 degrees for about 5 minutes.

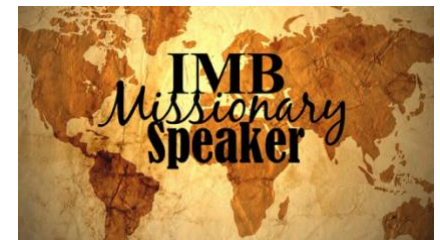
Why should you take time to read the Bible every day? Here are just a few reasons:

2. It feeds and transforms you. The Holy Bible is like a mirror before our mind's eye. In it we see our inner face and learn our spiritual deformities, beauties, progress, and distance from perfection. It guides you toward becoming the person God created you to be.
3. It provides wisdom for living. God's Word is active and meant to help you live out your vocation. The lessons from parables, the beatitudes, and other sacred texts are practical tools for daily life.
4. It sets an example for loved ones. Seeing someone in your family read the Bible encourages children and

others to develop their own love for Scripture.
