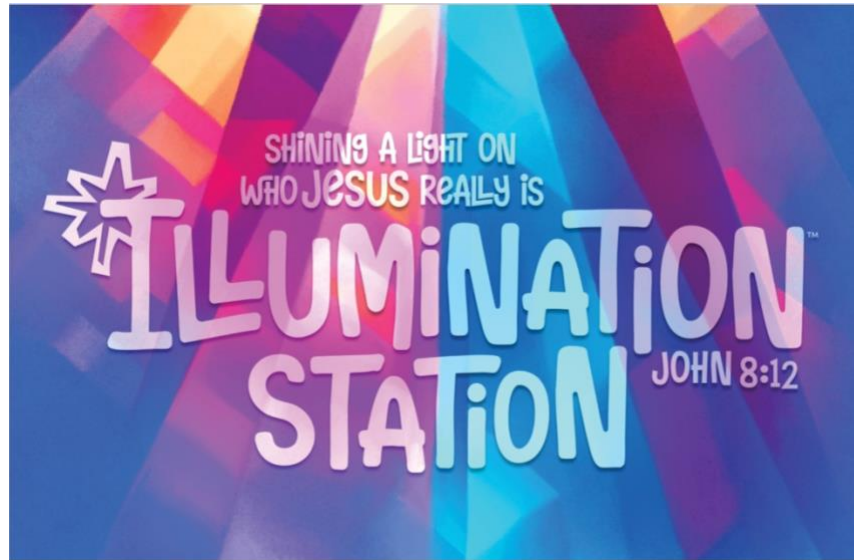

A Simple Reflection on Going to Church

Why It Matters So Much to Me

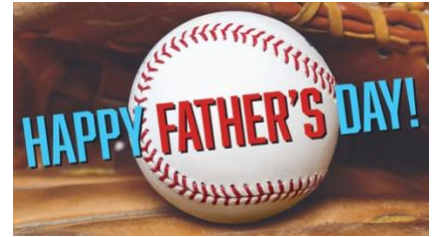
